



Thoughts on Romans

2:4 Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness and forbearance and longsuffering; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?

Having mentioned man's inexcusable and judgmental attitudes (2:1-3), Paul now questions the willingness of unregenerate people to accept the wonderful and gracious offer of salvation that God provides! How amazing it is that God is so loving and patient with mankind (note the words *forbearance and longsuffering* in this verse)!

One of the keys to understanding 2:4 is the word translated *goodness* [χρηστότης].

There are two Greek nouns which can legitimately be translated "goodness." These are ἀγαθωσύνη and χρηστότης.

The following comments about these two synonyms are based on Richard C. Trench, *Synonyms of the New Testament*, pp. 231-235.

"A man might display his ἀγαθωσύνη, his zeal for goodness and truth, in rebuking, correcting, chastising. Christ was not working otherwise than in the spirit of this grace when He drove the buyers and sellers out of the temple (Matt. 21:13); or when He uttered all those terrible words against the Scribes and Pharisees (Matt. 23); but we could not say that His χρηστότης was shown in these acts of righteous indignation. This was rather displayed in His reception of the penitent woman (Luke 7:37-50; Psalm 24:7-8); as in all other of His gracious dealings with the children of men" (pp. 234,235).

«χρηστότης, a beautiful word, is the expression of a beautiful grace.... The A.V. renders it 'good' (Romans 3:12); 'kindness' (II Cor. 6:6; Ephesians 2:7; Col. 3:12; Titus 3:4); 'gentleness' (Galatians 5:220." Trench also suggests "sweetness" as a possible translation on pp. 232, 233.

It is clear that God has a character of ἀγαθωσύνη which demonstrates the inward goodness of His holiness; He also has the amazing love which is expressed in χρηστότης!

On the one hand God cannot do *anything* which violates His holy nature; on the other hand, He chooses to manifest χρηστότης even to those who despise it!

John expresses this amazing truth in a slightly different way: And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) **full of grace and truth** (John 1:14).

Grace is God's love extended to us who surely do not deserve it; the truth is that we all deserve severe punishment in hell.

Paul is explaining that God's χρηστότης is leading people all over the world to repentance and Peter agrees when the Holy Spirit inspired him to write *The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance* (II Peter 3:9).


Both faith and repentance are blessings from God!


The seminary looks forward to a partnership with Dr. John Rataczak as he joins our adjunct faculty, concentrating on external studies.
